# TRIP REPORTS

### **SPRING 2015 – PTC TRAMPS and OTHER GOODIES**

Despite El Nino, I personally had a good August with good snow day-trips most weekends.

### Hamilton Peak circuit via Broken River Ski field – Sun 30 August 2015

Lead by Kevin H. on a brilliantly fine day but with a change forecast for the afternoon. We followed the usual circuit, parking at the tractor shed and walking up the road to cross under the ski tow, gain the Nervous Knob spur then sidle into Allens Basin, being careful to avoid ski runs. On the sunny faces it became a slower plug as the snow softened, but we were on the top ridge in good time to have lunch before the climb to 1922m Hamilton. After lunch we arrived on the top just as the cloud from the south did. So descending the south-east spur was a small concern to look out for the gentler terrain on the left that would take us down to Camp Saddle. It started to get wet as we began the descent. A parka would be good, but we waited until we were down a bit and after the bum-slide. Not a good decision. Yvette and I left that far too late! By 4.50pm we had regrouped at the bushline and were back at the vehicle at 5.10pm. We were: **Heather & Kevin Hughes, Merv Meredith & Yvette So**.

For me, September started well with the following Permolat track-clearing trip that Geoff Spearpoint organised.

### Waitaha Track Clearance – Sunday 6 to Thursday 10 September 2015

This was a 5-day task for Phil Novis and I. Geoff had Phil and I choppered in to Kiwi Flat Hut to work upvalley toward Moonbeam Hut and walk out on Thursday. While Geoff, Andrew Buglass, Andrew Barker and Sven Brabyn flew in to Moonbeam to work further up-valley, including County Stream. Then down-valley to stay at Kiwi Flat before walking out on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup>. By 3pm Monday, Phil and I had cleared and re-marked up onto the terrace, along the terrace and up around to the junction with Headlong Spur. We then needed to walk on to check out the state of the big slip into the Waitaha that had been putting everyone off in recent times. We could see why, with multiple recent slips. Climbing up the slip we found a good exit near the top to take us back west. So we sidled back, taping as we went and climbing higher as necessary to emerge a little up the Headlong Spur track, returning to the hut by dark.

On Tuesday and Wednesday we walked back in, marking and clearing a route on the eastern side of the slip down to the Moonbeam track and finished marking and clearing from the slip back to Headlong. Thursday morning we cleaned up at the hut, cut firewood, then walked in damp conditions back to our vehicle. Two days later when the Moonbeam four walked down valley, Andrew Barker explored and partly taped a lower sidle than ours that would save the height-gain up on to Headlong.

The sequel to this happened over Labour Weekend when the weather was pretty good on the Coast. Andrew Buglass and Doug Forster walked in to Kiwi Flat to cut and mark Andrew Barker's lower sidle. All done!



After that expedition, tramping for me was fairly slim. Henry-Anne-Boucher at the end of the month didn't happen, so Yvette and I did the day trip, below.

### Red Hill – Mt Lyndon – Sun 27 September 2015

Starting from the Lake Lyndon Lodge at 8.50am, we went over the low saddle behind the lodge and around the corner, we were on Red Hill in near perfect weather with hardly any snow, by 12 noon for lunch. Returning back along the top ridge and continuing north-east toward Mt Lyndon, we were puzzled by a sudden, brief burst of smoke from the Porters Pass direction.



Then we found ourselves arriving on the top at 3pm, at the same time as a group of ex-kiwi Australians. They had been at the lodge for a number of days and were exploring former stamping grounds from their youth—good to see. Descending the spur that leads to the lodge, we could see the Sunday traffic on the Porters road was stationary. However, by the time we got back to the lodge at 4.10pm and then drove out, the traffic was flowing slowly past the burnt-out shell of a camper-van. Since then, October tramping for me has been even slimmer. Glenroy Tops on 3-4 Oct didn't happen and there were strong nor-westers anyway.

### Mt Winterslow, via Don's Track – Monday 26th Oct 2015

The Labour Weekend, Freehold Creek – Dumb Bell Lake was cancelled with bad weather forecast. I was looking forward to camping up by Lake Ohau and exploring the tops. But Aarn and I did do Mt Winterslow on a warm, calm nor-west day. Walking from the Staveley end at 8.50am, we were soon up to the Don's Track turn-off and an uneventful climb up to the bush-line, allowing me to check out which sections of the track need attention next. Arriving on top at 12.30pm, it was interesting to see the peak with no snow cover, but the view of the Old Man Range behind, was still impressive. A leisurely summer-like lunch followed. Back to the vehicle at 4.15pm, we had seen all sorts of people out for a little walk up the falls track in the lovely Labour Day weather.

### Carrington Hut — 31 Oct – 1 Nov 2015

At 0700 when the car collected Jane in Avonhead there were two trampers on board. At West Melton Gavin joined us. The fourth, Graeme joined the team at Waddington and we were on our way. From Klondyke Corner we were walking by 0915 on a clear, calm day. The first bone-chilling river crossing was over the full flow of the Waimak as we headed over to skirt Turkey Flat. Opposite the Crow River we had a great view of the Crow Glacier and the low peak of Mt Rolleston. If you get stuck on river gravel too long the walk can become tedious but we managed to find long stretches of "carpeted" flats, and nearer the hut, a section through beech forest. Looking up Greenlaw Creek we thought we could see Mounts Harper and Speight where the club was hoping to go on Labour weekend but was put off by an un-favourable weather forecast. At Carrington Hut, early afternoon we had a choice of 36 beds in four bunkrooms. We were the only ones there. Not only that, there was a pleasing shortage of sandflies, unlike at Klondyke corner. After a cuppa we took a stroll up to the Clough Cableway. Back at the hut we had soup, read the hut literature and studied the map. Dinner was a lentil spaghetti concoction with the traditional custard dessert.

Sunday dawned fine and sunny. From the front door of the hut we were treated to the magnificent view of Carrington Peak. The walk back to the car was a simple re-tracing of Saturday's steps. We drove back still not knowing what had happened at Twickenham. We'd had a good long, flat walk.
