TRIP REPORTS

East Enders Track - Sunday 16 July 2017

On a fine Sunday morning at 9am our eight assembled at Barnett Park and lead by Helen--our very experienced east ender--headed up the quite muddy track towards the summit road. The Barnett Park track that goes to caves is disused since the Christchurch quakes. After a morning tea stop at a large water tank we headed parallel to Clifton Tce then zigged to the other side of the little valley towards the new development of Richmond Hill, once a farm and golf course. From Windsor Castle, a 298m hill, we followed the gravel road to the Summit Road, crossing over it to walk to Jollies Bush with its well-planned array of tracks and healthy-looking vegetation. At the lower reaches of the reserve we had a lunch stop. Four of us sat in the old stone shelter and four in the sun beside the summit road. In a cool breeze we climbed higher along the crater rim to reach 499m Mt Pleasant which gives a super view of Lyttelton.

Down a spur road, we reached the Summit Road via Broadleaf Lane and walked east to big pines to connect with the EE Track. We reached the cars at 3pm as the predicted rain arrived--all ten rain-drops of it. This was an enjoyable circuit with great views. MT WHITE 9TH JULY 2017

Mt White rises to 1741m to the north of Mt White Station. The station is a long drive in, back east after crossing the Waimak on the iconic Mt White bridge. Consequently we would look for a Plan B if the forecast was not good for the day. In July 2010 we scored a brilliant day with good snow. Since then we have scheduled the trip a few times but the weather has not played ball. THIS TIME, the forecast was good, promising little wind although we knew the snow would be limited.

So it was all go at church corner at 7.00am with nine in two 4WD's and John R to pick up at Sheffield.

Walking by 9.40am from the pig's fence down from the station buildings, we followed the same circuit as in 2010, along the farm track east to near the base of White Spur, up through a little bit of bush to gain the spur and follow it up. Through the bush we were really given the message by a few very vocal, possessive bellbirds. Above pt1529m the steeper south face was fairly crusty with little snow, so not easy and good to get up onto the upper spur, cross a shallow snow gully and up the final ridge to the top for lunch about 1.00pm. Still limited snow with cloud on the western side mostly blocking our view on that side, but great to be there again.

As planned, we descended the same way before dropping off steeply at a 'corner', to head more directly down toward a fenceline visible below and the station beyond. Back at the vehicles at 4.15pm we still had daylight to repack, do the money, feed the pig and start the long drive out. Definitely a good day out. We were:
