
Take a leap into the unknown beyond Google Earth and enjoy a tour of one of Christchurch's newest developing neighbourhoods!

The May night sky

The evening summer constellations are diving into the west; Orion sets in the evening and is followed by bright Sirius, the Dog Star, with Canopus high in the sky to its South. May evenings see the Southern Cross and the two pointers at their highest and most splendid in the Southern sky, surrounded by the glow of the Milky Way.

Looking North, the sky does not have much to show except the bright white star Spica, surrounded by the rather faint constellation of Virgo. Further towards the northern horizon is another bright star - orange Arcturus, the 4th brightest star in the sky.

Early evening, bright Jupiter rises in the East; fainter Saturn follows about two hours later. The more conspicuous of winter's constellations are rising too: above Jupiter is Scorpius with its distinctive curved tail, and the red giant star Antares forms part of its back. Alongside Jupiter is Sagittarius, which has been likened by the imaginative (or deluded) to a teapot, with its spout pointing at Antares and its lid pointing northeast. Venus rises in the pre-dawn sky about 6 am.

The centre of our Milky Way galaxy lies about 26,000 light years away in the direction of Sagittarius, but it's well hidden by intervening stars, gas clouds, and dust. If you could fly there at the speed of a modern passenger jet, it would take about 500,000,000,000,000 years. Take something to read.

New moon is 5th May, first quarter is on 12th, full moon on 19th, and last quarter on 27th.

TRIP REPORTS

Taipo River Kelly Range 13 – 14 April

Seven keen hikers met at Merv's 7.30 am Saturday morning. Our original plan was to tramp up the Taipo River to Dillons Hut on Saturday, then stroll up the river to the old cable way, and perhaps beyond. However, the weather had changed a bit with cloud and possible shower forecast on Sunday so the leader opted instead for the Carroll Hut route to ensure the best conditions over the Kelly Range.

By the time we got to Kelly car park and shuttled a car to the Taipo River we finally departed after 10.30am, which probably meant fading light at the end of the day? Just as we left, a van load of Cashmere High School students arrived intending to hike to Dillons Hut All 10 of them! Blue skies, calm and cool, we made our way slowly up the steepish Carroll Hut track through the damp bush. A couple of hours later, above the bush line, we had lunch in the sun, an hour from the hut. Carroll Hut sits on a tussock ridge with great views over the Aicken and Kaimata ranges. It's a popular hut in all seasons but not winter as there is no stove!!
